President Kathy Ratcliffe called the meeting to order at 11:30 am, using a gavel from past president, Patti Womble.

Kathleen Reynolds introduced Claudette Cooper, president of Garland County Master Gardeners, who presented a program entitled, "Tool Talk".

Kathy introduced the 2018 Pulaski County Master Gardener Board, and also thanked out going board members, Marylea Gazette, Vicky Kessel, Ann Filiatreau, Cathy Mayton, for their service.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Joellen Beard announced that there are 124 days until the state convention, and things are well on track. Registration will be open on February 1st. Volunteers will receive a different registration form. There will be many items for sale at the convention. Joellen brought a tumbler as an example. There will be two pre-conference tours offered. One will include a trip to P. Allen Smith's Moss Mountain Farm and Pinnacle Mountain State Park, and the other will tour the Pulaski Tech Culinary Institute, with a mystery basket cooking demo, lunch with a speaker on nutrition, a canning demonstration, and a trip to River Valley Horticulture.

Katherine Friday announced a "Save the Date" for a social event to be held on Saturday, March 25th. It will be a tour of Chris Olson's home, Edgemont House, in North Little Rock, from 1-3pm. Details are to follow.

Kathy reminded everyone to log in their hours as soon as they are acquired. That should eliminate the confusion at the end of the year. Kathy recognized Mary Helen Henry and Marylea Gazette for their tireless dedication as the record keepers. This is especially important as the cut-off date for reporting hours may be changed to December 15 instead of December 29 for 2017.

A new addition to the monthly meeting was, "Ramblings with Randy", an update from our county agent. He stressed the importance in attending the monthly meetings, and encouraged more MGs to volunteer for the Arkansas Flower and Garden Show. He introduced the new online training that is happening on the state level. It will begin in January of 2018, and will replace the Saturday training that has been happening over the past several years. Pulaski County will continue to have in-person training classes, but if Pulaski County people opt for online training, then mentors will become especially important to make the new trainees feel

they are a part of our group. Smaller counties may participate in interactive Zoom computer class.

Kathy asked if the new sign-in spot seem to work well for everyone, and encouraged everyone to pay their dues. She related the number of hours that PCMGs had contributed in 2016. 20,882 project hours corresponding to \$550,000. Education hours totaled 13,276.

Mary Helen Henry explained how to report the hours worked at the State Conference.


Dues are now \$30. If you have not paid, please do so.

2018 Arkansas Master Gardener Awards

The 2018 Arkansas Master Gardener Award season has arrived! Below you will find the nomination forms. The deadline to qualify for judging is January 15, 2018. These awards will be presented at the annual Arkansas Master Gardener Conference being held May 31- June 2, 2018 in Ft. Smith.

Each county is allowed ONE entry per award, up to a total of eight entries. The awards are 1. MG of the Year, 2. Rookie of the Year, 3. Project of the Year, 4. Excellence in Education, 5. County Agent of the Year, 6. Newsletter of the Year, 7. Friend of Master Gardeners, Individual, and 8. Friend of Master Gardeners, Business or Organization.

Two awards will be given for the following – MG of the Year, Rookie of the Year, Project of the Year, Excellence in Education, County Agent of the Year, and Newsletter of the Year – based on the county's membership size. County size is categorized as 50 members or less and 51 members or more. This membership count is based on your "active and in good standing members" found at the bottom of the Master Gardener Summary page of the online reporting system.

Please write your nomination based on the criteria of each award. ***Check and then double-check that you addressed the criteria, included digital photos or images to support your nomination and secured the signature of the Agent or President prior to sending in your nominations. Do not send in more photos or images than requested.*** The nominations will be sent to a panel of qualified judges selected by the County 76 RRR Project. The decisions of the judges will be final.

All nominations should be submitted from the local extension office after the county agent in charge of the MG program or the MG President has reviewed and signed the form. Please send all forms as a Word or PDF document. All photos should be high quality digital JPEG format and sized for a PowerPoint presentation. Please submit via e-mail or on a CD. To ease the judging process please make certain all forms are completed and signed and send in all completed nominations from your MG program together at one time.
