# Easy-to-Lure Butterflies Pipevine Swallowtail Pipevine, Aristolochia tomentosa Tropical, A. gigantea toxic to caterpillars Giant Swallowtail Native: Wafer ash, prickly ash, rue, citrus Rue, citrus Buckeye Native: Ruellia (wild petunia) Snapdragon, angelonia Fritillaries (Gulf and Variegated) Passionvine Beware red tropical plant Great-spangled Fritillary Violets Parenting style: Zebra Swallowtail Pawpaw tree Cloudless Sulphur and Sleepy Orange Native: Wild senna (S. marylandica) Candlestick tree (Senna alata) American Lady Native: Pussytoes, pearly everlasting Licorice plant (Helichrysum petiolare) Painted Lady

Native: Lots including certain malvas, native thistle
