This week we have received several calls about spots on oak leaves which turned out to be Oak Anthracnose. Typically, only causes minor damage and early defoliation, wait to treat it until bud break next spring. Plant Disease Notes



Needle blight has been popping up on one of my favorite evergreen landscaping plants, the Yew. Yew Needle Blight is a fungus that causes browning of the needles, when observed by a magnifying glass small pustule-like fruiting bodies can be observed. Avoid overhead watering and treat as soon as you see the presence of the disease.
